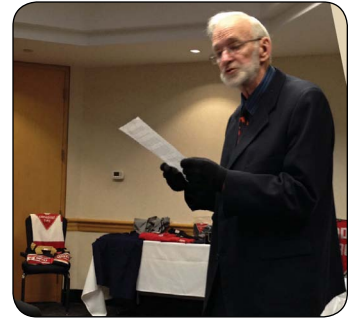

CTC S31-E12 - A SHORT SERIES

All denominations of coupons were issued in the CTC S31 series from the 5¢ to the \$2.00. The shortest series in this series is by far the \$2.00 issue, but it is still being issued at the moment. There were approximately 150,000 notes issued to date.

Of the denominations that have finished, in series CTC S31, and are being continued in series CTC S32, the 50¢ by far had the lowest mintage. Between the lowest known and the highest known there is only 450,000 possible notes.

Highest CTC S28-E07	3033999630
Lowest CTC S31-E12	3034000810
Highest CTC S31-E12	3034446899
Lowest CTC S32-E12	3034460631

This would mean that the changeover from CTC S28 to CTC S31 happened at 3034000000 and the changeover from CTC S31 to CTC S32 happened at 3034500000.

If you can prove otherwise, I would really like to hear from you.

Even in such a short run, errors can happen. As you can see on the above note there was a problem with one of the numbering heads. The known ranges are as follows:

Lowest	3/2034008809	
Highest	3/2034008964	Total = 155 notes
Lowest	3/2034108057	
Highest	3/2034108802	Total = 750 notes
Lowest	3/2034158816	
Highest	3/2034158994	Total = 178 notes

Lowest/Highest	3/2034258363	Only one known

Highest	3/2034358963	Total = 675 notes

So far we have a total of approx. 1800 notes known with these mismatched serial numbers.

After a closer look we can see that the numbering head in sheet position "08" or "58" is the one with a problem. No other sheet positions seem to be affected. It will be hard enough to find a regular note in this series let alone a mismatch.

THE BOB HOPE NOSE 3 VARIETY FOR S11-F \$1.00 VALUE

To continue with my installments on the Bob Hope Nose 3, I have put together a chart for the known locations for the S11-F \$1.00 value. The gap between each group is 220,000 notes, and 1000 notes between each unit within a group, very similar to the S11-G. I have found only one range where the variety is the 4th digit and that is the Q0483xxx range left side. From that range to 2.6 million I have not seen any of the variety left or right side.

For the right side I have found only one range where the 5th digit is the variety. The pattern was broken when I found the variety on the right side in the 6.8 million range. (I suspect that it may have begun in the 6.4 million range). Items in Bold are the numbers seen that I have added to the Specialized high low list. See chart below:

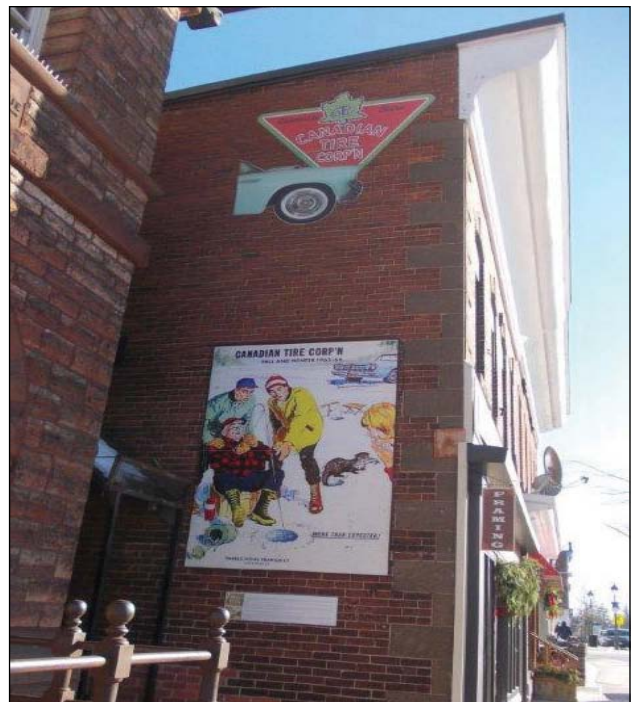
LOCAL HISTORY

Here's a little piece of history I found in my back yard that I did not know. I was driving from Pembroke to Kingston on my way home. I noticed this sign on the side of a building in Carleton Place, just south/west of Ottawa. I stopped and read this small plaque underneath these pictures of the old CTC logo and the 1965-66 Fall and Winter catalogue.

The Plaque Read. "In 1948 the Canadian Tire Corporation purchased the building and opened the First Canadian Tire Store in Carleton Place". Local CTC employee, Peter McFarlane was telling me that Elmer MacIntyre began selling Canadian Tire parts part time out of this barbershop in Almonte and when The CT Corp'n purchased the property in 1948, Elmer was the first franchise owner. The Corporation sold this location in 1971 after building a new store where the Carlton Place Market Square is now. Canadian Tire is now at highway 7 at McNeely Ave. Peter recollects the time he was delivering the CTC money pouch to the bank from the Canadian Tire store when he was SHOT TWICE in a robbery. He was hit once in the groin and once in the ear. Lucky the guy wasn't much of a shot. Peter often sits in front of the bank during the day enjoying the sunshine and chatting with the local passersby. Have a look! Perhaps he is there now!"

HOW TO FIND THE PRIMARY CHANGEOVER

WARNING! This article is not for everyone! It is comprehensive, technical, and maybe complicated to follow! I have tried to go logically like a detective in solving a complicated case. So read this article at your own risk! Writing this, for me, was challenging but fun, and who knows, you may end up being a detective too!

INTRODUCTION:

In 2001 the Canadian Bank Note Company was awarded a five year contract to print Canadian Tire Money. This of course has been extended as C.B.N. is still printing Canadian Tire Money with some help from outside sources.

The first of these coupons were the 5¢ and 10¢ CTC-S27 series of 2002 signed by Stanley Pasternak and Wayne Sales and they bear the '02' prefix. Like most new series, the numbering started at '0' (zero). Also, the '9' prefix was used to denote replacements in a parallel series.

WHAT IS A CHANGEOVER?

A changeover is when there is a significant change to the front or back plate such as a new signing officer; SIGNATURE CHANGE, or date of issue as found along the top border on the back of the coupon; DATE CHANGE.

The actual point at where the FIRST new CHANGED COUPON is found and the adjacent LAST old CURRENT ISSUE COUPON ends with the serial numbers one number apart is the PRIMARY CHANGEOVER. There is only one, this one, and no others.

The practice of the printer using up 'old' un-numbered stock of the previous series at random mixed in with the new, or changed series is the printer's option, and makes economical sense, but can cause us collectors a logistical and confusing nightmare! Not only is it confusing, all the 'old' un-numbered sheets used AFTER the primary changeover distort the quantity of both the previous series and the 'new' changed series,

so the accurate tracking of quantities printed of either series is lost.

Many collectors have tried to assemble extensive sets of changeovers and may have hundreds in their collections, but all of these changeovers of the previous series and the new series with higher numbered serial numbers than the recognized PRIMARY CHANGEOVER, are merely SECONDARY CHANGEOVERS. These higher serial numbered previous series are known as 'OUT OF RANGE' or 'ROGUE' coupons.

As mentioned above, Canadian Bank Note Company started this new contract with Canadian Tire in 2002, and the 5¢ and 10¢ notes begin at 0200000000. Unlike other series when major changes occurred, C.B.N. continued the numeric sequence from where the change occurred rather than starting over at 0 (zero). The result is an ever-increasing set of numbers unique to each denomination. These ever increasing serial numbers make finding, or at least locating logically where the PRIMARY CHANGEOVER occurs certainly more challenging, but not impossible!

HOW IS THE PRIMARY CHANGEOVER LOCATED?

At this point, I should mention that I do not have any examples of any PRIMARY CHANGEOVERS in my collection, but I know how to identify where they are and what the two serial numbers will be! Actually, physically finding them once they are issued is nearly impossible, but we know they exist. What I hope to pass on to you is the logistics of what to look for, by using four 5¢ coupon examples from the CTC-S27-B 2002 to the next date changeover of 2003. Although this example is a DATE CHANGEOVER, the method of locating any PRIMARY CHANGEOVER is the same. So now let's look at the four examples listed in serial number order, from lowest number to highest number of the four examples shown. All four examples are 5¢, CTC-S27-B and all are signed PASTERNAK-SALES.



EXAMPLE 1: CTC-S27-B-02 5¢
2002 serial numbers start at:
My lowest S/N as shown:

Beginning of 2002 range.
0200000000 (position 00)
0200003359 (position 03)



EXAMPLE 2: CTC-S27-B-02 5¢ Printing run of: 14,950,000 coupons.
*-2002 serial numbers end at: 0214949999 (position 49)
My highest S/N as shown: 0214931685 (position 31)



EXAMPLE 3: CTC-S27-B-03 5¢ Beginning of 2003 range.
 *-2003 serial numbers start at: 0214950000 (position 50)
 My lowest S/N as shown: 0214962683 (position 62)

***NOTE:** The two coupons bearing the actual numbers '0214949999' and '0214950000', which are only one number apart, is the one and only PRIMARY CHANGE OVER for these CTC-S27-B-02 to CTC-S27-B-03. Also note the underlined common '9' in the serial numbers in both example 2 and example 3. This will be commented on shortly under the heading 'LOGISTICS'.



EXAMPLE 4: CTC-S27-B-02 5¢ 2002 'Out-of-Range' or 'Rogue' coupons. Any 5¢ CTC-S27-B dated 2002 AND higher than the lowest 2003 coupon or in this example ANY 5¢ dated 2002 with a S/N 0214950000 or higher is an 'Out-of-Range' or 'Rogue' coupon.
 My highest S/N as shown: 0230342922.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR, OR, HOW TO COME TO THE ABOVE CONCLUSION OF EXACTLY WHERE THE PRIMARY CHANGE OVER IS:

Simply collect a series. Any signature, any date, any denomination. Note the next change. Then, narrow down the change as LOW as you can find. (lowest S/N) Then try and find the HIGHEST numbered coupon BEFORE the change. (highest S/N)

Here is where COUPON POSITIONING on sheets is important. Coupons are printed in 50,000 note blocks. 1,000 sheets of 50 coupons each = 50,000 notes and each sheet contains 50 numbered coupon positions. It takes 2 batches of 50,000 to make each 100,000 range, or combined, 100 numbered positions. From position '00' to position '99' over 2 combined batches.

LOGISTICS:

If you go back to our examples, you will see, in this case, both the last of the 2002 dated notes (example 2) and the first of the 2003 dated notes (example 3) share the same 100,000 numbered range: that being the 900,000 range. See the underlined '9' in the serial numbers.

Therefore, the first half of this 900,000 range will have coupon positions from '00' to '49' and all coupons numbered '00000' to '49999' are all dated 2002. I know that because my EXAMPLE 2 has a position '31' and is dated 2002. Position '31' is between '00' and '49' and there is a position '31' on every sheet between '00000' and '49999', or the 1,000 sheets to

make the 50,000 note block. EXAMPLE 2 bears sheet number '685' together with position '31', and ALL 50 positions in this example will end in '685'. Now if there is a position '31' dated 2002 on all 1,000 sheets, there will also be a position '49' dated 2002 on all 1,000 sheets, as all 50 positions of each sheet will be dated the same. So if position '31' sheet '685' is dated 2002, so will position '49' sheet '999' be dated 2002. There can't be any random 2003 sheets in this 900,000 to 949,999 as they have not been printed or issued yet.

After coupon numbered 949,999, the new 2003 dated sheets started appearing but these new dated coupons are in the second half of our 900,000 range. To prove that, go back to EXAMPLE 3 which has a position number '62' and is dated 2003. Position '62' is between position '50' and '99' and there is a position '62' on every sheet between '50000' and '99999' or the 1,000 sheets, to make the next 50,000 note block. EXAMPLE 3 bears sheet number '683' together with position '62', and ALL 50 positions in this example will end in '683'. Now if there is a position '62' dated 2003 on all 1,000 sheets, there will also be a position '50' dated 2003 on all 1,000 sheets, as all 50 positions of each sheet will be dated the same. So if position '62' sheet 683 is dated 2003, so will position '50' sheet '000' be dated 2003. Since this is a new extended printing to where the 2002 numbering ended, then this block of 50,000 coupons will all be dated 2003, and complete the second half of our example '900,000' range.

As the initial printing of un-numbered 2003 sheets are numbered and used up, and depending on CTC's quantity demand of Canadian Bank Note, the printer has the option of printing more 2003 dated sheets or using up current stock of now-out-dated, but perfectly good 2002 dated sheets. In our example, the signing officers are the same and the date line on the back of the coupon is small, so it becomes an obvious choice to use up 'old stock' for future serial numbering. As the printer uses up these un-numbered 2002 sheets, the result is 'OUT of RANGE' or 'ROGUE' coupons. To make this procedure less obvious, Canadian Bank Note pressmen blend both un-numbered 2002 'old' sheets with perhaps what is left of the 2003 'new' initial run.

Now how the pressmen load the presses to use up the 'old' stock creates for us collectors bands from one 'old' 2002 sheet between two 2003 sheets, to several, to even hundreds of 2002 sheets in the 1,000 sheet, 50,000 note blocks. And, where ever a 2002 dated note is sequentially numbered next to a 2003 dated note, or vice-versa, becomes a SECONDARY CHANGEOVER.

This practice will tend to continue until all the 'old' 2002 un-numbered stock is numbered and issued. If we look at EXAMPLE 4, which is an out-of-range 2002 dated coupon, the serial number is: 0230342922, or coupon number: 30,342,922. Compare that to the PRIMARY CHANGEOVER number of: 0214950000, or 14,950,000, and it appears that the 2002 printing of the CTC-S27-B-02 5¢ could be over 30 million, when we

know it is only about half of that! This creates a distorted and inflationary mintage figure.

If you check the Bilodeau Guide or Lou Fontaine's mintage quantities for this example, Lou has taken this PRIMARY CHANGEOVER into consideration and the mintage is the same at 14,950,000 coupons as explained in this article. As we have no idea how many 'old' stock sheets the printer has numbered and issued amongst 2003 dated sheets, we have no way of telling for sure exactly how many 2002 numbered coupons actually exist. (This also applies to the 'new', or now current 2003 series when it is finished, and 2004 series notes start appearing) The EXAMPLE 4 shows the highest numbered 2002 coupon I have found. There could be even higher numbered 2002 dated 5¢ coupons still out there, or you could have a higher numbered coupon in your collection.

CONCLUSION:

These 'OUT of RANGE' or 'ROGUE' coupons are for interest only, and do create hundreds or even thousands of SECONDARY CHANGEOVERS in all ranges, series, and denominations. This does create a collecting niche for many of our collectors and that is good!

So, although this article is fairly long, technical and maybe complicated for some, I have tried to explain in as logical and straight forward a manner as possible, the importance and significance of the PRIMARY CHANGEOVER.

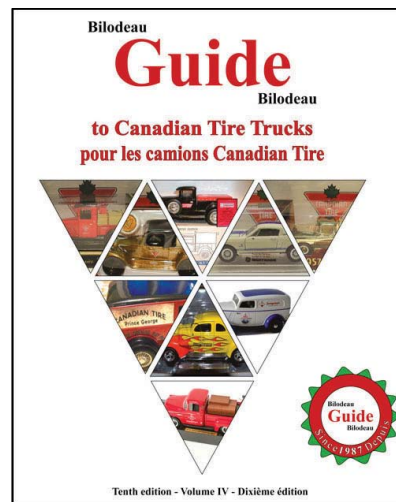

THE STORY OF THE ONLINE AND CLIPOUT CANADIAN TIRE MULTIPLIERS

These online coupons appear weekly on the internet and are downloadable, they are the same value as the multiplier coupon for that week. They then need to be printed. As the samples shown here they are different in appearance and be-

cause each computer uses a different program and has a different printer the sizes vary along with the printing that can be done in colour, black and white, or greyscale. The smallest I have is 5 1/4" x 2 1/2" while the largest is 11" x 5 1/4".



The online coupons, on the left in colour, grayscale in the center and the store coupon on the right. Note the 2 different layouts and the size of the gas pumps.

The 12X clip-out coupons came in 2010 when you applied for a Canadian Tire Credit Card and came on the instruction sheet, you cut it out and used it at the gas bar. The first ones had the month spelled till October 2010 then the dates were all numerical. The front is white, black and red all with a 12X in red. They are blank on the back except for some dotted lines. The issue dates are usually several days in a row then they skip

a few. Also the font for the date varies, small, large and sometimes both for the same date, and on December 31, 2011 the large font and bold date first appeared. Again in 2014 some dates appeared with the date in alpha form. Also a few were missing a colour and were orange instead of red. Samples are shown below.



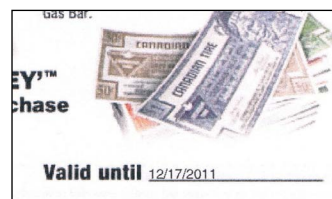

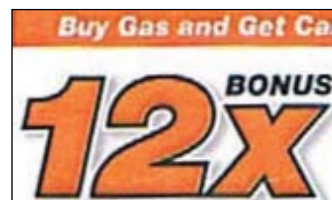

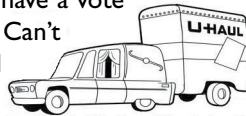

THE SUCCESSION PLANNING WORKBOOK

What started off as an education topic at a recent RCNA meeting in Mississauga, has become a broad discussion amongst collectors of not only CTC coupons but collectors in general. Conceived by Toby Grimminck and Roger Fox, the subject of "what to do with your collection" as we all gracefully age and start thinking about an updated will, or the eventual disposition of one's assets. It's not a subject that is fun to think about, and it's one that is very easily put off until tomorrow, but it's also one in which you should put some effort and planning into today if you're looking to save your family one whole lot of time and trouble when you no longer have a vote into your affairs. The old adage of "You Can't Take It With You" is true, so one should plan ahead.



Having a plan "A" and a plan "B" is the answer, but among all the other discussions we had at the RCNA meeting, one thing kept coming up. What is my collection worth? Perhaps more importantly, how much can my heirs expect to get for it if I'm not around to oversee the dispersal? As our club auctioneer, I have now done a couple of estate auctions and I've become very aware of this question.

There are many reasons that we as collectors do not keep track of, or at least broadcast, the value of our collections, even

those with whom we should share this information. With this discussion still fresh in our minds, it is perhaps the time the club took a more proactive approach to this subject. The Succession Planning Workbook is not the perfect tool, but it is a start. It's basically a series of Excel spreadsheets you can use to create a record of the value of your collection. The spreadsheet lists all the coupons in the Gas Bar and the Store series. All you have to do is enter the grade of each of your coupons and the spreadsheet will compute the value for you. You can optionally list coupons in your stash, or even enter misc. items in your collection. The summary page will give you three totals. The Replacement Value is the cost of replacing your collection if you paid Bilodeau value for each coupon. The Auction Value is the reserve price your collection would be worth to start an auction, and the Street Value is the approximate price your collection would fetch in an auction after all the auction costs were deducted. (ie: postage, PayPal fees, club commission, etc).

This is not a perfect tool. There is no way we can keep this updated as new series evolve, or as Bilodeau values fluctuate, however, it is intended to be a "snapshot" of your collection and the total can be updated when you fill holes in your collection and add them to the worksheet. The spreadsheet is available to all members on the club website, or you can email me at adamsdoug@rogers.com and I'll send you a copy.

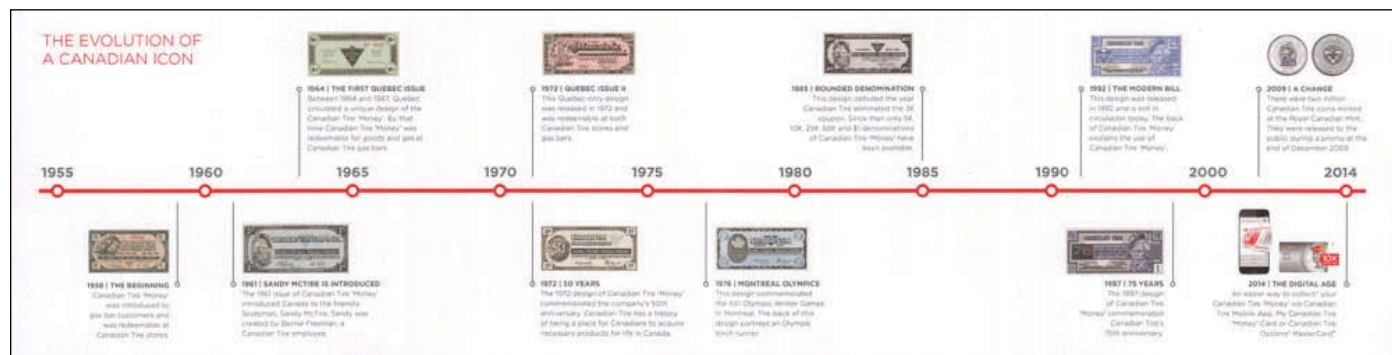
CTC'S NEW COLLECTOR CARD

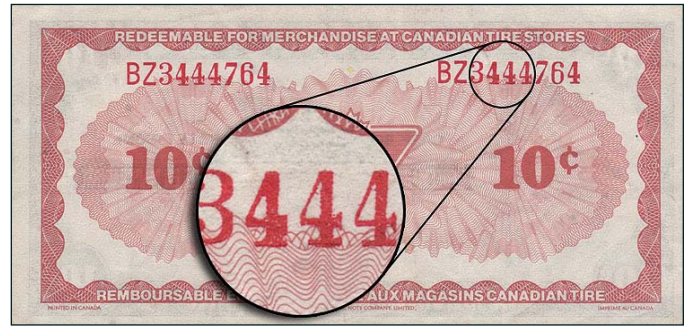

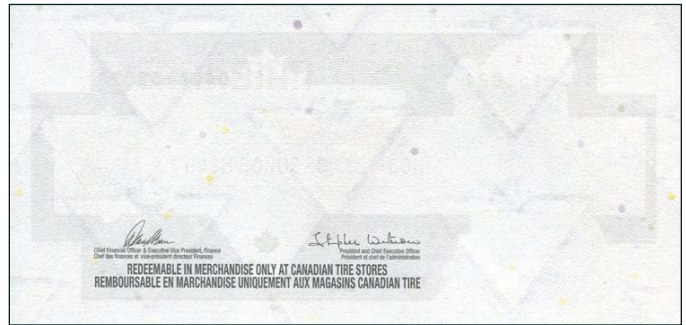
